RSPS COVID-19 Travel Policy Update Parents and Students

As we complete our 12th week of instruction, 1/3 of our school calendar, we are asking that all Rancho community members continue to follow the Return to Campus Guidelines if you will be traveling at any time during the school year. We have much to celebrate, but if you are unsure of the possible status of your child upon return from travel, we ask that you contact the Rancho COVID chairs at: Wecare@ranchosolano.com

To reiterate, we expect our members to follow school rules and guidelines and let us know if your child will be going to Distance Learning (DL) for a self-quarantine period. Additionally, we are asking parents to communicate with their respective Principal and *Wecare* in regard to self-quarantine, need for DL and the expected return date based on the guidelines.

Travel is designated as high, moderate or low risk and return dates should be calculated based on the following risk factors. It is your responsibility that when you plan your travel you understand and know what your exposure risk is and what that means for your child's return to either in-person learning or to quarantine while distance learning:

- Location(s) visited*
 - Method of travel (commercial or private aircraft, personal or rental car, cruise ship, public transportation, etc.)
 - Possible exposures (layovers, hotel stay, etc.)
 - Participation in large gathering events (particularly where social distancing isn't possible)
 - Your personal commitment to recommended precautions including social distancing, wearing a mask and hand hygiene practices
 - Any known exposures that may have occurred during your time out of state
 - **Current CDC, WHO, ADHS or other credible agency guidelines for your destination**
 - Any local, state or national mandates that require quarantine upon return.
 - You must be aware of current CDC mandates upon travel.
1. High Risk Travel: Will require a 14-day quarantine from the date of your return from the trip.
 - a. All international travel that cannot be conducted in private vehicle(s)
 - b. International travel by private vehicle must be done with minimal exposure risk in your activities. (Minimal risk example: Private condo, VRBO, bring own food, avoiding large resorts and restaurants or any increased social interaction. Your interactions and activities may put you at more risk than travel)
 - c. Travel (domestic as well) that includes large gatherings and high-risk activity within social settings.

- d. If at any point in your travel you feel that you or your children could have had a high-risk exposure then you need to protect our community and have them do a 14-day quarantine and do distance learning until return date as previously stated.

2. Moderate Risk Travel: May return to in person learning upon return with symptom checks done daily and notification to your campus nurse if any symptoms occur. This includes extra precautions and sanitation measures.
 - a. Travel within the US via public transportation while implementing safe practices
 - b. Moderate risk exposure activities, which may include small family gatherings and implementing safe practices in social activities in public spaces that may increase risk
 - c. Minimizing exposure risks by; mask wearing in all public spaces, minimal public transit involvement and all other CDC guidelines for risk management are expected from all members. If you cannot follow these then you will need to plan to quarantine your child(ren) upon return.

3. Low Risk travel: Minimal risk exposure activities
 - a. In-state travel by car and other travel that does not fit into the above categories
 - b. You may return to campus after your travel without quarantine, unless requested by your primary care provider.
 - c. You are expected to immediately notify your principal or school nurse in the case that you develop symptoms

Individuals with existing respiratory disease, disorders that affect the immune system, and other serious health conditions may be at a higher risk for severe illness from contracting COVID-19 during any type of travel and may wish to consult their primary care provider for recommendations upon return from travel.

The Rancho Solano travel policy is in effect regardless of previous diagnosis of, or exposure to, COVID-19. Rancho Solano may evaluate each case on an individual basis to determine an appropriate course of action if there is a question of exposure risk. We are counting on everyone to self-report travel that requires quarantine. Failure to do so puts our community at risk and will be reviewed for proper action.
